Life in Dry Bones

Approximately six centuries before the time of Christ, the children of Israel were carried out of their land into the land of Babylon and settled on the Chebar River. The city of Jerusalem had been overrun, the temple destroyed, and the walls broken down. In Ezekiel 37:1-14, we read how God guided His prophet Ezekiel to make a prophecy concerning the valley of dry bones and get an idea of how Ezekiel felt. The people of Israel were feeling doomed: "Our bones are dry, our hope is lost, and we ourselves are cut off!"

Ezekiel was brought out of the city and set down in the middle of the open valley that was full of dead men's bones. When God said to Ezekiel, "Son of Man, can these bones live? Ezekiel said, "O Lord God, You know". God told him, "Prophecy to these bones, and say to them, 'O dry bones, hear the word of the Lord! Thus says the Lord God to these bones: "Surely I will cause breath to enter into you, and you shall live. I will put sinews on you and bring flesh upon you, cover you with skin and put breath in you; and you shall live. Then you shall know that I am the Lord." God told him that "these bones are the whole house of Israel."

We do not know how many bones were there but they are described as "very dry" in Ezekiel 37:2. This meant there was no hope for life so far as these bones were concerned. They were so bleached and so dead that it was impossible to bring life to them. In verse 9, He called for the wind to bring breath to them that they might come to life again. When the breath came to them, the dry bones lived, stood upon their feet and became a great army. Like the Israelites, it is possible for Christians to get to a point where our bones are dried up and our hope is gone. If we quit listening to the word of the Lord and allow sin to separate us from Christ, our congregations can also become "full of dead men's bones". Our life is in Christ and only in him (John 1:4, 1 John 5:11). Through Christ, Christians have hope. God will always breathe the breath of life back into our dry bones if we will allow Him.
